


WHY INVEST IN THE CORE?

ORGANIZATIONAL EFFECTIVENESS


10% Avg. grant allowance for indirect costs (vs. 35% standard for private business)

- Chicago non-profit that upgraded accounting software and updated financial processes
- Saved hours of staff time, used to serve clients instead, and ended inaccurate financial reporting
- Faster reporting and data accuracy led to opening of new early childhood program
